RECENT EXHIBITIONS AND TALKS

Our current major museum Exhibition, "**Radlett and the Railway**" tells the story of how the railway transformed our village from a rural hamlet into a thriving commuter town. The exhibition runs until the end of August 2026.

Our Spring "**What's in a Name**" display linking local place names to local heritage and events, proved very popular. It was initially exhibited in the museum and later transferred to the Apthorp Gallery at the Radlett Centre.
